AIANTA Membership consists of tribes, organizations and individuals who believe in our Mission: *To define, introduce, grow and sustain American Indian, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian tourism that honors traditions and values.*

Membership Levels

Tribe: Tribal governments may authorize membership and designate five (5) individuals as representatives entitled to cast one (1) vote, for a total of five (5) votes per Tribe.	\$500
Business/Organization: Businesses may designate one (1) representative entitled to cast one (1) vote. Choose the level for your business.	
Corporate Benefactor:	\$3000
Tribal Enterprise: Entity is owned by a tribe.	\$500
Non-profit Organization: Non-profits must be a 501c3 or 501c4.	\$300
Business/Organization A: 10 for fewer employees	\$500
Business/Organization B: 11 – 20 employees	\$600
Business/Organization C: 21 or more employees	\$750
Individuals: Any individual may join and may participate in AIANTA activities. Each Individual shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote.	\$150
Senior: Any person who is age 55+ may join and participate in AIANTA activities. Each Senior shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote.	\$50
Student: Any person enrolled in a post-secondary education institution is eligible and may participate in activities. Students may not vote and are not be eligible to be elected to the Board of Directors.	\$50
